Investment objective

The Fund invests primarily in common stocks of companies in developed countries outside the United States. Normally, the Fund invests at least 80% of its total assets in stocks of companies in a number of foreign countries, and invests the majority of its total assets in companies that pay dividends or repurchase their shares.

Market commentary

Equity prices continued to decline in the second quarter as accelerated central bank tightening and recession fears weighed on the outlook for economic growth. The top performing markets in our investable universe were China, Hong Kong, Portugal, Spain, and Indonesia. The worst performing markets were Sweden, South Korea, Israel, Ireland, and the Netherlands. The best performing sectors in the MSCI EAFE Index ("Index") were energy, consumer staples, and health care. The worst performing sectors were information technology, materials, and industrials. Currency proved a headwind as major currencies declined against the US dollar.

The Causeway International Value Fund ("Fund") outperformed the Index during the quarter, due primarily to stock selection. Fund holdings in the banks and consumer services industry groups, as well as an overweight position in the energy, pharmaceuticals & biotechnology, and household & personal products industry groups, contributed to relative performance. Holdings in the insurance, transportation, and utilities industry groups, along with an overweight position in the technology hardware & equipment industry group and an underweight position in the telecommunication services industry group, offset some of the outperformance compared to the Index. The top contributor to return was integrated oil & gas company, TotalEnergies SE (France). Other notable contributors included retail bank, CaixaBank SA (Spain), airport operator, Beijing Capital International Airport Co., Ltd. (China), pharmaceutical giant, Sanofi (France), and health food & beverage producer, Danone (France). The largest detractor was jet engine manufacturer, Rolls-Royce Holdings Plc (United Kingdom). Additional notable detractors included electronic equipment manufacturer, Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. (South Korea), electric, gas & renewables power generation & distribution company, Enel SpA (Italy), business software & services provider, SAP SE (Germany), and airport operator, Aena S.M.E. SA (Spain).
