Investment objective

Causeway Concentrated Equity Fund seeks long-term growth of capital.

The Fund invests at least 80% of its total assets in equity securities of companies in the U.S and in developed and emerging countries outside the U.S. The Fund will typically hold between 25 and 35 investments. Equity securities include common stock, preferred and preference stock, and depositary receipts.

Market commentary

Global equities declined again in the third quarter as many central banks reiterated their commitment to fighting inflation. The top performing markets in our investable universe were Turkey, Brazil, Indonesia, India, and Chile. The worst performing markets were Poland, China, Colombia, the Czech Republic, and Hong Kong. The best performing sectors in the MSCI ACWI Index ("Index") were energy, consumer discretionary, and financials. The worst performing sectors were communication services, real estate, and utilities. Currency proved a headwind as major currencies declined against the US dollar.

The Causeway Concentrated Equity Fund ("Fund") underperformed the Index during the quarter, due primarily to stock selection. Fund holdings in the capital goods, materials, technology hardware & equipment, and utilities industry groups, along with an overweight position in the insurance industry group, detracted from relative performance. Holdings in the software & services, banks, and pharmaceuticals & biotechnology industry groups, as well as an underweight position in the semiconductors & semi equipment and telecommunication services industry groups, offset some of the underperformance compared to the Index. The largest detractor was rolling stock, signaling, & services provider for the rail industry, Alstom SA (France). Additional notable detractors included jet engine manufacturer, Rolls-Royce Holdings Plc (United Kingdom), consumer retailer, Carrefour SA (France), electric, gas & renewables power generation & distribution company, Enel SpA (Italy), and paper & packaging solutions company, WestRock Co. (United States). The top contributor to return was casino & resort company, Las Vegas Sands Corp. (United States). Other notable contributors included mortgage insurance provider, Essent Group Ltd. (United States), banking & financial services company, UniCredit S.p.A. (Italy), business process outsourcing services provider, Genpact Ltd. (United States), and financial services technology company, Fiserv, Inc. (United States).
