Market commentary

Despite idiosyncratic, country-specific challenges and continuing trade tensions, emerging market equities posted modestly positive returns in the third quarter of 2018. The MSCI Emerging Markets Index ("Index") returned 0.11% in local terms but -0.95% in USD terms during the quarter. Buoyed by Brazil, the largest constituent country in the region, emerging Latin America was the top performing region group in the Index. The emerging Europe, Middle East and Africa ("EMEA") region also delivered positive returns in local currency terms. Emerging Asia was the poorest performing region group in the Index as trade tensions weighed on Chinese equities. Energy, materials, and industrials were the top performing sectors during the quarter. The consumer discretionary, health care, and real estate sectors were the weakest performers.

The Causeway Emerging Markets Fund ("Fund") underperformed the Index in the third quarter of 2018. We use both bottom-up and top-down factors to forecast alpha (return in excess of the Index) for the stocks in the Fund's investable universe. Our bottom-up value factor category was a strong indicator of performance during the quarter and has delivered positive returns for the year-to-date period. The earnings growth factor category was a negative indicator during the quarter but it has been the strongest factor over most recent trailing periods. The price momentum factor category, as measured by our technical factors, was a negative indicator during the quarter. Of our top-down factors, the macroeconomic and country factors were negative and the sector and currency factors were positive during the quarter.

Over the quarter, Fund positioning in the emerging Asia region detracted from relative performance versus the Index as negative stock selection in India, Taiwan, and South Korea was partially offset by positive stock selection in China. Within the emerging Latin America region, positive stock selection in Mexico contributed to relative performance. Fund positioning in the EMEA region, including stock selection in South Africa, contributed to the Fund's relative performance. From a sector perspective, the largest detractors from relative performance were information technology, industrials, and real estate. Positioning in the energy, health care, and telecommunication services sectors contributed to relative performance. The largest stock-level detractors from return versus the Index were overweight positions in electronic components manufacturer, Yageo Corp. (Taiwan), online services company, Tencent Holdings Ltd. (China), and products & services provider for the electronic components industry, SK hynix, Inc. (South Korea). The greatest stock-level contributors to relative performance were an underweight position in electronic & print media platform operator, Naspers Ltd. (South Africa) and overweight positions in oil & gas exploration & production company, China Petroleum & Chemical Corp. (China) and state-owned oil & gas company, PTT Public Co., Ltd. (Thailand).
