Normally, the Fund invests the majority of its total assets in companies that pay dividends or otherwise seek to return capital to shareholders, such as by repurchasing their shares.

Market commentary

Concerns over economic implications of Russia’s invasion of Ukraine and the potential for a faster pace of interest rate hikes to combat inflation weighed on equities in the first quarter of 2022. The top performing markets in our investable universe were Brazil, Peru, Colombia, Chile, and South Africa. The worst performing markets were Russia, Egypt, Austria, Ireland, and Hungary. The best performing sectors in the MSCI ACWI Index (“Index”) were energy, materials, and utilities. The worst performing sectors were consumer discretionary, communication services, and information technology.

The Global Value UCITS Fund underperformed the Index during the quarter, due primarily to stock selection. Fund holdings in the capital goods, materials, banks, technology hardware & equipment, and insurance industry groups detracted from relative performance. Holdings in the software & services, pharmaceuticals & biotechnology, consumer services, and transportation industry groups, as well as an underweight position in the retailing industry group, offset some of the underperformance compared to the Index. The largest detractor was social media giant, Meta Platforms, Inc. (United States). Additional notable detractors included banking & financial services company, UniCredit S.p.A. (Italy), jet engine manufacturer, Rolls-Royce Holdings Plc (United Kingdom), plastic packaging manufacturer, Berry Global Group (United States), and business software & services provider, SAP SE (Germany). The top contributor to return was energy supermajor, Shell (United Kingdom). Other notable contributors included travel & tourism technology company, Sabre Corp.(United States), retail bank, CaixaBank SA (Spain), defense & information technology services provider, Leidos Holdings, Inc. (United States), and paper & packaging solutions company, WestRock Co. (United States).
